Ord. 91-2	2/15/1991	Authorizing guaranty of a loan from the Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority to the Municipal Authority of Borough of Dauphin in the principal amount of \$1,037,000 to finance cost of improvements to sewer system of the Borough.
Ord. 06-02	2/7/2006	Authorizing and directing issuance of a general obligation note in the maximum principal amount of \$150,000 pursuant to the Local Government Unit Debt Act to pay design and related costs of improvement to the Borough's sanitary sewer system.
Ord. 07-01	2/6/2007	Securing a guaranteed sewer revenue bond in the amount of \$2,353,000 to be issued to the United States of America acting through the Rural Utilities Service, United States Department of Agriculture pursuant to the Pennsylvania Local Government Unit Debt Act.
